The wedding procession was headed by Miss Mary Harrison, who descended the stairs, wearing a dress of rose silk and yellow hat, and carrying a staff of beautiful Shafter daisies. Following came little Margaret Barr carrying the wedding ring upon a silver platter. The lovely bride came next, wearing a short, white satin wedding gown with white tulle and long court train. Miss Anne Gillem, a sister of the bridegroom, followed as train-bearer. The bride was met at the foot of the stairs by her father, who escorted her to the bridegroom. Lieutenant Gillem, accompanied by his best man, Lieutenant Quessenbury, received the bride standing beneath a large and beautiful bell composed of Shafter daisies.
