

Mexican Border War

THE SITUATION ON ARIZONA BORDER

Gen. Ojeda, with 475 men, 3 machine guns and ammunition and supply wagons, made a fine march yesterday through rain and snow from Agua Prieta to Naco, Sonora arriving there at about 7:30 last evening.

Ojeda is expected to hasten today to Cananea to make a junction with the 250 federals there and then go to Nogales to assist Kosterlitzky in defense against 1000 Constitutionalists expected to attack his position today.

Report last night that advance of the forces to relief of Kosterlitzky will be intercepted by armed forces from the Ajos and Cananea, probably at the railroad junction point out of Cananea, and numbering more than 1,000 men, may prove true.

Three troops of the Fifth Cavalry entrained at Huachuca siding, minus their mounts, last night for Nogales, assigned to protect the American town if need be.

1000 Maderistas arrived from Yzabatl station on a special train that reached Agua Prieta at 8 o'clock last night.

A detachment of U. S. troops followed the course of the Ojeda troops yesterday along the line to see that there was no crossing over.
